REFLECTIONS COMMITTEE

The Reflections Committee wants to congratulate all participants for this school year. We also want to encourage our Sangster students to begin working on their entries this summer for the National PTA's 2013-14 Reflections Program. The theme is "Believe, Dream, Inspire."

Each year through Reflections, the PTA recognizes students for their artistic efforts at local, regional, state and national levels. The National PTA Reflections Awards include:

1. **Outstanding Interpretation**

Award: Presented to one student in each arts category in

each division (Primary, Intermediate, Middle School, High School and Special Artist) and also for the best theme interpretation. Recipients receive \$800, a gold medal and a \$200 award for their local PTA. Awardees are recognized at the National PTA Annual Convention and Exhibition, and their artwork is displayed at an exhibit in the U.S. Department of Education in Washington, D.C.

2. **Award of Excellence:** Presented to the top three scores for each arts category in each division. In 2012, the National

PTA recognized 72 students with Awards of Excellence. Recipients receive a \$200 award and a bronze medal, are mentioned in the National PTA's Awards Ceremony Program, and may also be highlighted during an exhibit at the U.S. Department of Education in Washington, D.C.

3. **Award of Merit:** Presented to the next five highest scores for each arts category in each division. In 2012, the National PTA recognized 116 students with Awards of Merit.

WOUNDED WARRIORS TO RETURN

In an effort to promote perseverance, individuality and strength of character, the MSG has invited active duty military members who have overcome injuries to share in Field Day with our students. both physical and mental.

Not only are they Warriors on the battlefield, but they are also important participants in contributing to the growth of our children. Sangster Summer Stock Musical Theater Camp

Sangster Summer Stock — a youth musical theater camp for ages 9-13 — will be held July 9-20, from 9:30 a.m.-1 p.m. daily.

Auditions for casting purposes only will be held on Thursday, June 13. The cost to participate is \$350 per child (\$300 for the second child). Tuition discounts and tech crew positions are available.

For ten nonstop days, youngsters will participate in a musical theater camp that lets them experience life as a summer stock performer. Children with all levels of performance experience will work on musical theater techniques, voice, song study and movement while they intensively rehearse for a musical that will be performed on the last day of camp. They will also build scenery and props and be introduced to the technical-side of theater production. It's a fun and rewarding experience as students work to successfully put up a major musical in just two weeks.

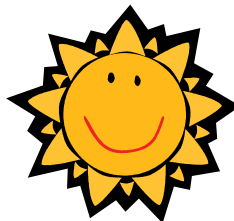
