As we move into January, I find that there are a lot of activities available for our parents this month.

A couple of special opportunities have come about that we are hosting or co-sponsoring. Each of these, I believe, can be very helpful to our school community.

The first event, which we are hosting on Monday, Jan. 27 at 6 p.m., is an opportunity for our parents to come and hear about how to interpret the county's new standards-based progress report. We know that there are a lot of misunderstandings about how to read your students' progress reports and know what they reflect regarding your students' quarterly

achievements and how the marks were determined.

That evening, we will have **Suzanne Whaley** from the county's Instructional Services Department sharing how to best utilize the information on the progress report and use it to support your students in their educational experience. During our January staff meeting, all our teachers will meet with Suzanne to have their questions addressed as well to make sure that teachers are implementing the new progress reports properly and with a clear understanding of how they should be using data to assign marks. Our goal is to do our best to give everyone the same information.

We want to all get on the same page so that teachers are giving parents accurate information on each student's performance in all subject areas and that parents are interpreting this information accurately. The early start time that evening is because of the presenter's schedule. The length of the presentation — with time for questions and answers — should be around an hour.

We have a second recently added evening event that we are co-sponsoring with the West Springfield pyramid schools. On Thursday, Jan. 23 from 7-9 p.m., **Kirk Martin** will present his program, "Stop Defiance and Disre-

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### **Level IV Advanced Academic Program Screening Information Meeting**

An informational meeting for the Level IV Advanced Academic Program (AAP) will be held Tuesday, Jan. 21 at 7 p.m. in the Sangster Cafeteria. This meeting will cover important dates, work samples, additional paperwork and center expectations. The Level IV AAP is a highly challenging instructional program in the four core subject areas.

Students qualify for this program through a county-wide screening process that considers the Gifted Behaviors Rating Scale With Commentary, ability test scores, achievement test scores, report cards, work samples, and parent input on the referral and questionnaire. All second-grade students are considered each year based on assessments given in first and second grade. All students in grades 2-6 can also be considered if a parent submits the Level IV AAP Referral Form (available in all schools and online). All referrals are due to Sangster Elementary before 4:30 p.m. on Feb. 3.

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spect: Eliminating Power Struggles and Sibling Fights” at Washington Irving Middle School in Barker Hall. Several people with whom I have spoken have shared how helpful and enjoyable Mr. Martin’s programs have been for them. We are excited to be able to co-sponsor this event and encourage you all to come to Washington Irving for this dynamic program. Invite your friends to come as well.

**Dr. Karen Garza** recently shared the 2015 FCPS budget proposal with the media. As you have read about the proposal, I am sure that you are very aware that it calls for cutbacks in ways that greatly affect your students. I would encourage you to review the budget, recognize that what Dr. Garza has presented (which includes a reduction of 731 positions across the county) is contingent on the Board of Supervisors giving

the school division a 5.71% increase. Without that increase, the cuts will be much more severe. Now is the time to begin letting your supervisor know if you support the proposed budget.

The Board of Supervisors will be releasing their budget plan on Feb. 25. Your input now could help the school system avoid further impacts on class sizes, programs offered to our students and reductions in teaching positions. Please let your voices be heard!

I am saddened to share that our crossing guard, **Mrs. Rodriguez**, had a family tragedy on Dec. 18. That morning, her 21-year-old daughter, Ali, had an as-of-yet undetermined episode that resulted in her untimely death. Ali was working toward a degree in Meteorology and had visions of working in television broadcasting. She had been diagnosed with Rheumatoid

Arthritis when in high school and was to receive an infusion at Fort Belvoir that morning. The Rodriguez family requested that, in lieu of flowers, donations be made in the name of Ali to the Arthritis Foundation-Greater Southwest Chapter.

Lastly, we are saying goodbye to **Senora Ingrid Butler**, who has worked in our Spanish FLES program for the past six years. She is retiring after spending more than 19 years working for Fairfax County Public Schools in several capacities.
